Mandate & practice

Castlereagh Fellowship believes that Christians are called to be “global” in outlook. We are to be concerned with the advancement of the Gospel message throughout the nations, with the plight of suffering people in general and persecuted and materially poor followers of Christ in particular, and with the upholding of laws based upon Christian morals and values.

To these ends, Castlereagh Fellowship:

- **supports the production and distribution of evangelistic Christian literature**
- **organises an annual collection on behalf of persecuted Christians**

Castlereagh Fellowship incorporates a “Mission Focus” into our weekly Sunday morning service. This usually takes the form of a video update from a particular missionary/mission representative, followed by prayer.

From time to time, Castlereagh Fellowship – or members thereof – have organised/participated in Mission Trips, whether in the British Isles or further afield. Such trips have served to enthuse and energise the Fellowship’s interest in mission.

Castlereagh Fellowship has been adopted as a supporter church of the Bangor Worldwide Missionary Convention which meets in August each year.
